

SUNDAY OF THE ENTRANCE INTO GREAT LENT



From the Desk of the Pastor

“Lord, may we enter into your Kingdom, its Gates are opened through prayer and fasting.”

As we begin our yearly Lenten Fast let us ponder these words from our liturgy: the Gates of Paradise are opened through fasting. Indeed, the Gates of Paradise are thrown open by the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ – but, also, through his other salvific works on our behalf – including all his works of fasting. We, ourselves, are called to enter the Gates of Paradise by fasting. As we begin another year’s great fast let us recommit ourselves – as a parish, and as individuals, to the call of our Lord and His Church to truly embrace the spirit and discipline of the Fast of Great Lent.

It was through fasting that Nineveh avoided destruction, it was through fasting that Ezra bested Satan, it was through fasting that Samuel recovered the Ark of the Covenant, it was through fasting that Esther combatted evil, it was through fasting that Daniel achieved greatness in Persia, and on the list goes throughout the entirety of Scripture. It was through fasting that the power and mercy of God was made known to his people throughout salvation history. As we battle so much evil, sorrow, and desolation in our own days, let us do so through fasting.

In our Syriac Tradition the Lenten fast is traditionally practiced in the following manner: from the evening of Cana Sunday until dinner on the Eve of Easter no food or drink is to be taken until the afternoon (or midday at the least) excluding Saturdays and Sundays and certain great feasts. No meat, fish, shellfish, dairy, or alcohol is to be consumed during the fast. This is the traditional and ideal practice – let the perfect not be the enemy of the good, so tailor this fast to your physical and logistical capability. But, fasting is not supposed to be easy. It is supposed to be uncomfortable; it is a test of our spiritual and physical fitness. I am praying that our parish may truly enter through the Gates of Paradise this year through a renewed and fervent commitment to the beautiful gift of fasting and prayer that the Church has given us.

Great Lent

The **Fast of Great Lent** begins on **Monday, 12 February**. We will celebrate **Liturgy at 7:00pm**. The blessing and distribution of ashes will take place at the liturgy on this day only. **NAM will sponsor a Lenten Meager Meal at 5:30pm** before the Liturgy.

Fasting

As a reminder, fasting in the **Syriac Maronite tradition** consists of **abstaining from all meat, dairy products, and alcohol from Midnight until Noon Monday-Friday of Great Lent**. A light meal may be taken in the afternoon but without meat, dairy, or alcohol. Traditionally, fish is also excluded during Great Lent. Saturdays and Sundays are exempt from the Lenten Fast.

Easter Bourbon Raffle

We will host a **Bourbon Raffle** on Sunday, 31 March. **Tickets are \$25** and **only 250 tickets** will be sold. Tickets can be purchased through the **Parish Office** and **During the Lenten Fish Fry**. We are also **accepting donations** of bottles of Bourbon and Scotch for the Raffle!

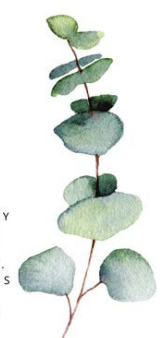
